1. Apologies for Absence

2. Matters arising

i) Student Council Constitution

3. Outdoor Seating/Outdoor Classroom

Quotes have been received for this project: works of £1,060.00 from Fairmax for wood chip area partially shaded by trees and parasols; Seating £2,108.00 from Marmax for five picnic benches with parasols and bases.

Total cost £3,168.00

Budget £4,648.32

The contractors have also been asked to quote for the cost of a rubber matting type covering which is much easier to maintain and provides better drainage.

It was suggested that we use some of the budget to top up the money raised for the work if it falls short. It was agreed subject to the final amount.

7. Any Other Business

i) Discussion Groups.

The students split into groups to discuss ideas suggested in the surgeries, the outdoor classroom and the Year 6 visits.

The suggested one way system on the top floor of the main block was discussed to ease congestion between lessons. Mrs Thompson will discuss with Mrs Cogley and then ask Mr Duckworth to raise the idea with SLT.

Sports activities were discussed and Mrs Thompson will ask Mr Smart if he would meet with the group to discuss ideas put forward by the student body.

Consideration was given to how we can raise money to pay for the work on the outdoor classroom.

Mrs Thompson will arrange a meeting with Mrs Anglim to discuss the year 6 visits, the students will consider what message they wanted to get over to the year 6 pupils about the transition to high school. They have started a draft booklet with reassuring advice.
