School Leavers' Guidance 2018

IF YOU HAVE GOT THE RESULTS YOU REQUIRE

ENROLMENT DETAILS:

When you enrol, you **must** take **proof of your GCSE** results and any **other evidence of qualifications from Year 11**. You **must** also take any communication you have already had from the college and it will be helpful to take **some form of identification**, for example a passport or National Insurance card.

ENROLMENT DAYS & TIMES:

Runshaw

Go to the College where staff will be available from 9.30am to offer course guidance

Hutton Sixth Form

Enrolment at Hutton C of E Sixth Form Centre – Thursday 23rd & Friday 24th August between 9:00am and 4.00pm, or e-mail Mr J Hill on j.hill1@huttongrammar.org

Cardinal Newman

Students will have received their own time and day of enrolment on the documentation sent to them by the college. This will be either on Thursday 23rd August or Friday 24th August

Wigan and Leigh

All day on the Thursday 23rd August at the Parsons Walk site

Winstanley

Students will have received their own time and day of enrolment for 23rd August. Those who have not applied can simply go to the college between 10.00am and 5.00pm on 23rd August and register for courses

Myerscough

GCSE results and advice sessions at the Bilsborrow site are between 10.00am and 7.00pm Thursday 23rd August, between 10.00am and 7.00pm Friday 24th August and an advice session between 9.45am and 12.30pm on Saturday 8th September

On the Witton Park campus, staff will be available from 10am to 4pm on Thursday 23rd August and again there is an advice session between 9.45pm and 12.30pm on Saturday 8th September

KGV

Any students who have applied to college will receive a letter inviting them to attend college on Thursday 23rd August between 9.00am and 4.00pm to enrol on their courses. We do also offer a session on Friday 24th August if students cannot make it on the Thursday.

Again for students who haven't applied but decide they would like to come to college just need to come along on Thursday 23rd and there will be dedicated staff available to go through the application and enrolment process with them.

Southport

Any students who have applied will receive an enrolment pack through the post giving them a time to come in and enrol which is specific to the course they have applied for. These times are set to stagger the students

coming in however they are not set in stone; students can pretty much come in at any time across Thursday 23rd and Friday 24th August.

Any students who haven't applied to Southport but decide they would like to come and enrol on one of our courses we advise to come along to college at any time across the two days and someone from the course team will be available to speak to them.

IF YOU HAVEN'T QUITE GOT THE RESULTS YOU REQUIRE

Students who haven't quite made the grade, please *don't panic*. You won't be the only person in this situation but the quicker you act the easier it will be to resolve this.

Advice from Bishop Rawstorne

If you are unsure as to what you should do, please go and speak with Mr Almond, Mr Duckworth, Mr Rawlinson, or Miss Palmer who will be available in school to help you with any decisions.

Advice from Runshaw

All Bishop Rawstorne students should come along to enrol, no matter what their results and Runshaw will provide you with advice and guidance. If you haven't reached the required grades then they will look at alternative courses.

Advice from Hutton

If you haven't achieved the grades still go to enrol and discuss your situation with a member of their team.

Advice from Cardinal Newman

If anyone has an appointment but doesn't quite get the grade the college encourage you to still attend your enrolment appointment and discuss their options with the enrolment team.

Advice from Winstanley

They guarantee a place to all students who achieve 44 points or more (this is equivalent to four GCSE passes grade 5 and four GCSE passes grade 6)

All other colleges advise that you go along and speak to them about your situation and you will normally find they can accommodate you, just perhaps not on the course of your first choice. If you are in this situation again take with you all your certificates and ID as well as anything else that will show that you are a student of good character, for example, any certificates from awards assemblies as well as many other examples.
